Although these letters come through the City, please know that it is a multi-jurisdictional effort that includes Aransas County and the Town of Fulton. Our level of cooperation is unmatched. We are truly One Voice --working together to rebuild.

We can all give in some way to not only help our family, friends and neighbors, but the entire recovery process, too. Did you know that your "donation" can count as a contribution to the city/county/town's rebuilding effort and FEMA match? FEMA has a "program" that puts a dollar value against each volunteer effort. New News:

1. We remain in a BURN BAN and Curfew – 11 pm – 6 am. These are safety measures as there are few working streetlights, not to mention stoplights, AND we want to prevent the risk of fires in our tinder house of a community.
2. Debris Removal. Today marked Day 28. It was announced that 483,217 cubic yards of debris have been picked up by Crowder Gulf and TxDot, including 4,727 appliances. A clarification of the debris removal process was made today -- approximately 38% complete for the FIRST PASS.
3. Aransas County Library. Library is open Monday – Friday from 9 am – 6 pm and Saturday 10 am – 2 pm. Computer access is available.
4. SAS Shoe Outreach. SAS will be providing a pair of ADULT shoes to those in need on Wednesday, October 4 from 10 am – 7pm (or until supplies last) at St. Peter's Episcopal Church, 555 Enterprise Blvd
5. 7. Federal Agency Reports. FEMA has registered 13,000 individuals and provided more than \$21 million. SBA has processed 223 loans totaling more than \$18 million.
8. Free Concert. The Rockport-Fulton Chamber of Commerce and Asleep at the Wheel, 10-Time Grammy-Winning Kings of Western Swing, are hosting a concert on Saturday, October 7 from 5 – 9 pm at the Festival Grounds at Rockport Harbor.
9. Deadlines for Assistance Agencies. Deadline for Red Cross Application for Assistance is October 10th and October 24th for SBA.
10. Long Term Recovery. **As mentioned in an earlier letter, the County has hired Mike Koerner to serve as the Long-Term Recovery Coordinator. He started work late last week and is laying the groundwork for building teams, volunteers and special/unmet needs, which includes overseeing the distribution of money from the fundraising campaigns and building supplies. The Homeowner Intake form may be revised and residents are asked to hold on to them for the time being. A draft of the Long-Term Recovery plan is in the works. At today's EOC meeting, it was announced that the area's complete recovery may take up to three years.**
11. Donations, Volunteers and Assistance.

There is an immediate need for volunteers every day. All volunteers must sign a liability waiver at the Volunteer Reception Center before obtaining work orders. Worth Reminding:

1. Utility Bills. The City is waiving charges for water customers during the period of 8/15 – 9/14 because of extensive damage caused by the hurricane and service interruption. The next bill will be for the period of 9/15 – 10/14. If you haven't had the opportunity to make a payment on your previous bill, please know that there will be no cutoffs or late charges at this time.
2. Disaster Recovery Center. **UPDATE.** We have put together a multi-agency resource center in the old HEB parking lot. It is a consolidation of state, federal and relief organizations under a huge tent. This includes FEMA, SBA, TWIA, Red Cross, Americorp, the Distribution Center headquarters and Unmet Needs.
3. CodeRED. If you have not signed up for CodeRED emergency announcements, there is a direct link on the City's web site or through this app link:

4. The list of Verified Contractors is on the City's web site is updated regularly. As of 9/26, there are 989 registered contractors. There have been 10 complaints lodged against contractors and five companies have vacated. The registration/verification process is to ensure, among many things, that the contractors have proof of liability insurance and state licenses.
5. Local Businesses. As businesses open, the Chamber will add them to a list and publish it on their web site. This is for ALL businesses, not just Chamber members. **If your business is open and you're not on the list, please alert the Chamber.**
6. Aerial Views. Drones have been taking photos of the Hurricane Harvey aftermath. Residents who wish to view before and after views of the area, should visit Harvey2017.eagleview.com
7. Garbage. Continue to put your household refuse in your blue bin. **Do not block the bins with debris or vehicles as the automated trucks are unable to access many bins on their rounds.** Make separate piles for building debris, trees/limbs AND appliances. Place them close to the curb or on your property – not the street. The **Transfer Station** will operate 7 days a week from 7 am – 6 pm for an indefinite period. **Residents should**

enter via Prairie Street. Commercial contractors must take their debris to a landfill. Here is a link for landfills in Texas – <https://wastebits.com/region/Texas>

8. If you or anyone you know has provided FREE assistance to our area, such as volunteer clean-up, food, equipment or materials, in-kind donations, etc., please deliver or mail this information to the Rockport-Fulton Chamber of Commerce, 319 Broadway, Rockport, TX 78382. 9. Rebuilding. If you have suffered significant damage and are rebuilding, you will need to obtain a building permit in person at the Service Center. Due to the high volume of inspection requests, the Building Department can no longer provide same-day inspections.
