

A Message from Mayor Wax

We urge you to use these letters, and information posted on City/Town/County web sites, as an accurate source of information coming from the Long-Term Recovery (LTR) and other government and disaster recovery-related meetings.

TONIGHT is the deadline for placing hurricane debris curbside or in right of ways.

Remember to separate your piles into vegetation, building materials and appliances. Later this week, the LTR will begin publishing the list of cleared streets. Although your street may not have been cleared, you should not continue piling debris.

- a) Please call the Long Term Recovery Center at 361-790-9496 if you have special needs.
- b) Marine Debris and Private Property Debris removal are still being coordinated through the LTR Center.
- c) The Navigation District is sweeping Little Bay and Rockport Beach Park for marine debris.
- d) The Army Corp of Engineers is in town surveying the amount of marine debris along the coastline
- Volunteer Reception Center. There are over 400 volunteers in town, including students on Spring Break, who are here to assist with property clean up, repairs, tree removal, moving mobile/manufactured housing, etc. Please sign up at the Volunteer Reception Center at First Baptist Church, which is located at Enterprise and Live Oak or call 727-9011.
