RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of a resolution and order duly passed by the City Council of the City of Rockport, Texas, on the 3rd day of December 1962, an election was held in said City on the 21st day of December 1962 on two propositions for the issuance of the bonds of said City of Rockport, Texas in the following amounts and for the following purposes, to wit:

\$160,000 revenue bonds for the purpose of constructing improvements and extensions to the City's Waterworks System; and

\$40,000 revenue bonds for the purpose of construction improvements and extensions to the City's Sanitary Sewer System

AND WHEREAS, on this the 21st day of December, 1962 there came on to be considered the returns of said election; and

WHEREAS, upon consideration of the returns of said election, it appears that the same was in all respects legally held, after due notice had been given, and that the said returns were duly and legally made; and

WHEREAS, it further appears from said returns that there were cast at said election 96 votes on the proposition for the issuance of \$160,000 revenue bonds for Waterworks Improvements and Extensions, of which number 96 votes were cast "**FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$160,000 REVENUE BONDS FOR WATERWORKS IMPROVEMENTS AND EXTENSIONS AND PLEDGING THE REVENUES OF THE CITY'S COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM OF THE PAYMENT THEREOF**"; and 0 votes were cast "**AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$160,000 REVENUE BONDS FOR WATERWORKS IMPROVEMENTS AND EXTENSIONS AND PLEDGING THE REVENUES OF THE CITY'S COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM TO THE PAYMENT THEREOF**"; and

WHEREAS, it further appears from said returns that there were cast at said election 96 votes on the proposition for the issuance of \$40,000 revenue bonds for Sanitary Sewer System improvements and extension, of which number 96 votes were cast "**FOR THE ISSUANCE OF \$40,000 REVENUE BONDS FOR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS AND EXTENSIONS AND PLEDGING THE REVENUES OF THE CITY'S COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM TO THE PAYMENT THEREOF**" and 0 votes were cast "**AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF \$40,000 REVENUE BONDS FOR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS AND EXTENSIONS AND PLEDGING THE REVENUES OF THE CITY'S COMBINED WATERWORKS AND SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM TO THE PAYMENT THEREOF**";

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKPORT, TEXAS:

Section 1: That the aforesaid election was duly and legally called and notice thereof given in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the resolution and order calling said election; that said election was held in strict conformity with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the returns thereof have been properly made to the officials of the City entitled to receive same; that only resident qualified property taxpaying electors of the said City of Rockport, Texas, who owned property therein, and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, were permitted to vote at said election; and further that said election property represents the desires of those qualified to vote as aforesaid.

Section 2: That the proposition to issue the \$160,000 revenue bonds for the purpose of constructing improvements and extension to the City's Waterworks System was sustained by the majority of the resident qualified electors of said City, voting at said election, who own taxable property in said City, and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, and that the City Council of said City is authorized to issue said bonds and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds in the time and manner prescribed by law.

Section 3. That the proposition to issue the \$40,000 revenue bonds for the purpose of constructing improvements and extension to the City's Sanitary Sewer System was sustained by the majority of the resident qualified electors of said City, voting at said election, who own taxable property in said City, and who had duly rendered the same for taxation, and that the City Council of said City is authorized to issue said bonds and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds in the time and manner prescribed by law.

permitted to vote at said election; and, further, that said election properly represents the desires of those qualified to vote as aforesaid.
