## **UPDATE: FLOODING AND STREET CLOSURES FOR ROCKPORT AREA AS OF JULY 8, 2021 AT 8:00 P.M.**

ROCKPORT, TX – Almost all streets have water issues and there are certain streets that have become impassable. Motorists should take extra care at the following locations as some of these streets have high water and may be closed or impassable:

1. 16<sup>th</sup> Street
2. 18<sup>th</sup> Street
3. 400 Augusta
4. Balderee
5. Bay Ave.
6. Business 35 from McDonald's north to Chaparral in Fulton
7. Champions at Royal Oaks Drive
8. Champions at Traylor
9. Chaparral between Lanfair and Business 35
10. Enterprise at Live Oak
11. Enterprise from Live Oak to Omohundro
12. FM 2165/Pearl Street from Linden to Business 35
13. Jim's Smokehouse Road
14. Lamar Drive
15. Market Street from Business 35 S. to Hickory Ave.
16. Market Street from S Austin Street to S Magnolia Street
17. Nopal near Austin
18. Omohundro Street from Maple to Enterprise
19. Picton Ave.

20. Pearl Street from Business 35 S to Orleans Street – FM 2165 toward Bypass,  
standing water near County Service Center
21. Sorenson Street
22. South Austin Street
23. South Live Oak Street
24. South Magnolia Street
25. Sun Harbor at Mesquite
26. Traylor at Peachtree
27. Treasure
28. Water Street
29. Whistler’s Cove Streets
30. 100 block of Sparks Drive (not in City)
31. Bois D’Arc (Lamar) high standing water
